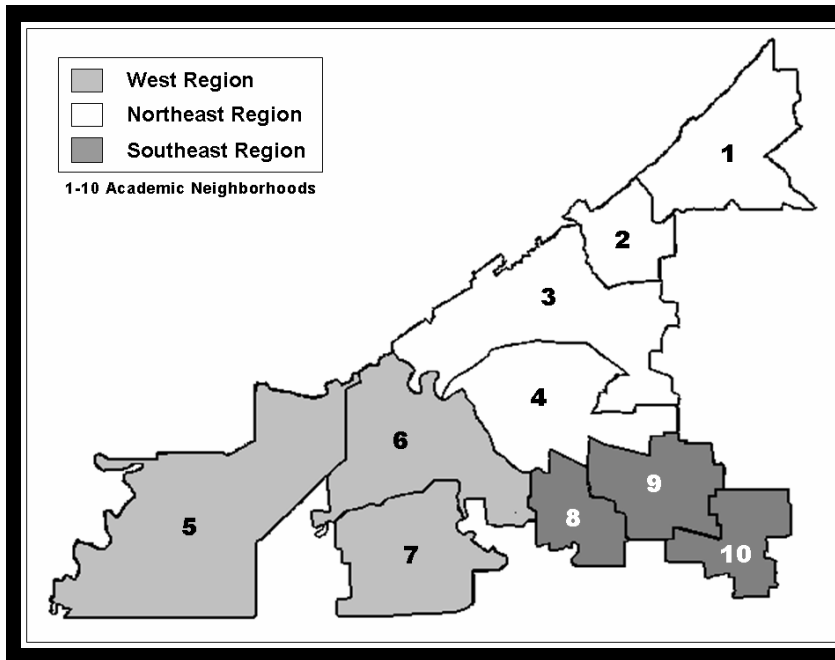

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES**

This form is an application for an open enrollment transfer. Open enrollment is for students who wish to attend a school different from their District-assigned school. Not every student who applies will receive an open enrollment transfer. **Students are required to attend their District-assigned school until their open enrollment application has been approved.**

*Falsification of information on this application may result in denial/removal of open enrollment privileges.*

### **GENERAL DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION POLICIES:**

- All students in grades K through 5<sup>th</sup> living over two (2) miles distance from their *District-assigned school\** are transported on a CMSD school bus.
- All students in grades 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> living over two (2) miles distance from their *District-assigned school\** are transported by RTA.
- All High School students in grades 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> living over three (3) miles distance to their *District-assigned school\** are transported by RTA.
- Single gender transportation qualifications will be limited to the applicable academy closest to the current residence.

**Unless specifically identified as a city-wide draw, students whose open enrollment transfers are approved are not eligible for transportation to their new school. Parents are responsible for transportation.**

(\*The school you are assigned by the District based upon your home address.)

### **HOW ARE APPLICATIONS APPROVED?**

A lottery will be held if there are more student requests than space available after the application period. Approvals are not based on a first-come, first-served basis. Applicants will be notified of their final assignments in the final 2009-10 report card mailing.

#### **APPLICATIONS FOR TRANSFER WILL BE APPROVED OR DENIED ON THE FOLLOWING BASIS:**

- **Space:** Students may not be able to transfer if the school or the grade level to which they are applying is filled to capacity.
- **Audition Process:** Cleveland School of the Arts Lower Campus (PreK-6) and Cleveland School of the Arts Main Campus @ Harry E. Davis (6-12) only
- **Test Scores:** Gifted Education Program: Benjamin Franklin, Garfield, OH Perry, Riverside, Wade Park and Whitney Young
- **GPA/Test Scores/Interview:** Tremont Montessori (Grades 1-8) and John Hay Academies only
- **Language Screening:** Buhner Dual Language School; The International Newcomers Academy; Thomas Jefferson

### **HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY AS RELATED TO OPEN ENROLLMENT TRANSFERS**

9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics for one (1) calendar year if they change high schools, except under certain conditions outlined in OHSAA guidelines in accordance with regulations of the state Board of Education.
