

Supplemental Educational Services (SES)

FREE TUTORING

The No Child Left Behind Act is an education–reform bill passed by the United States Congress and signed into law in January of 2002. No Child Left Behind dramatically increases the role of the federal government in K-12 education, focusing efforts on increased student achievement, teacher quality, and accountability for results.

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) are additional academic instructional services designed to increase the academic achievement of students in schools that have not met State targets for increasing student achievement for three or more years.

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) includes the following:

- **Includes tutoring and after-school services.**
- **May be offered through public or private-sector providers that are approved by the State of Ohio.**
- **State approved providers include public schools, public charter schools, local education agencies, educational service agencies and faith-based agencies.**
- **Students from schools that have failed to meet state standards for at least three consecutive years are eligible to receive Supplemental Educational Services.**
- **Parent Notification Letters will be mailed to the homes of all students eligible for Supplemental Educational Services.**

- **The No Child Left Behind Act does not permit students to access Supplemental Educational Services (Free Tutoring) and Public School Choice (Transfer).**
